Counseling Services Help People of West Michigan

The Franciscan Life Process Center (FLPC) has offered counseling services to the West Michigan community since 1983. "We believe in the potential of every human person to grow, change, and develop a better life," Center Director and therapist Sister Colleen Ann Nagle, FSE states. "We hope to guide our clients to know what is normal and healthy and to develop meaningful relationships in their lives."

Specialties

Marriage and family therapists work with individuals, couples, and families with an emphasis on relationships in the clients' lives.

School counselors offer individual counseling to help students resolve personal and interpersonal issues that interfere with success in the classroom and at home.

Play therapy, a method of psychotherapy used with children ages 3 - 12, utilizes both play and verbal communication to provide the counselor with a means of communicating with young children through a medium that comes naturally to them, play and toys.

EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing) is used in the treatment of traumatized individuals and relieves many types of psychological stress in people of all ages. Mindfully creating a safe "here and now" allows clients to look back at past events.

Psychological assessments and tests are tools used to help better understand and work with each client. There are a multitude of psychological tests, and they can be administered for a variety of reasons. The decision to administer assessments and tests is done on an individual basis.

Sister Colleen Ann Nagle, FSE, MA, LPC sees private clients and is the director of the Franciscan Life Process Center.



Know the Franciscans

Sister Barbara Cline, FSE MA, PhD

Sister Barbara Cline, FSE currently works for the Diocese of Grand Rapids as Director of Faith Formation. "Our job is to support parishes in developing effective programs that lead children, youth, and adults to faith and to what it means to be Catholic." It includes meeting with parish catechetical leaders, supervising the certification program for catechists and Catholic school teachers, and planning the Parish Ministry & Catechetical Conference each fall.



Sister Barbara grew up in northwest Iowa and had one sibling. She has a Master of Arts in Early Childhood with a minor in developmental psychology, a Master of Arts in Theology, and a PhD. in Special Education Administration.

Prior to her employment at the diocese, Sister Barbara has worked with children and youth with disabilities and their families for over 50 years. This work led her to the Middle East as the Director of Catholic Relief Services for the West Bank including the West Bank, Gaza Strip, Egypt and Morocco. "Much of our time there involved helping mothers and their infant children in their homes and villages," Sister states. In Cameroon, West Africa, she worked in a physiotherapy center for children, youth and adults who came from numerous countries around Cameroon. Upon her return to the US, Sister helped establish Michigan's Early On, an early intervention program for children where she served as a state trainer and technical assistant coordinator.

Sister Barbara has close ties to the Lowell Campus. She was one of the first sisters who arrived in Grand Rapids in 1972 and founded the Franciscan Life Process Center in June of that year. In addition to her work in the diocese, she meets with 30 individuals seeking spiritual integration, sometimes called spiritual direction, at the Center. "The purpose of spiritual integration is to help people integrate their spiritual life with their daily life. How does Christ inform us, bring us to see his presence daily?" Sister smiles, "What we often call 'coincidence' is God at work in our lives."

ASK and FLPC Music Therapists Help in Area Classrooms

Autism Supports of Kent County (ASK) has partnered with the FLPC for over 10 years to provide music therapy services in autism classrooms throughout Kent County. Each summer, classroom teachers apply for services through ASK and, after contributing \$100, enroll in our music therapy program to receive services in their classrooms once a month. These services provide an opportunity for students with autism to receive the specialty music therapy services that shape experiences to the learning style of the students. Without the support of ASK, this program could not happen since public schools often do not have the funding available to provide such service.

"Our students love music therapy!" shares Jenneth Wright, autism resource teacher at Emmons Lake Elementary School in Caledonia. "They show a high level of engagement during the activities, and they enjoy having time to sing with their friends. We have noticed growth for them in the areas of flexibility with turn-taking and with communication. Thank you for giving us the chance to participate in a worthwhile and meaningful program through the collaboration of Autism Support of Kent County and the Franciscan Life Process Center."
