Center Develops Strategic Plan

Center Director, Sister Colleen Ann Nagle, FSE and the leadership staff have developed a strategic plan for the future development of the Franciscan Life Process Center. Sister says, "In 2021, we will be celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Center. This is a perfect opportunity to identify the essential elements of each program and clarify our goals as we move forward."

Based on our mission statement, "To promote a relationship with God that brings dignity and hope to the sacred process of all life," the strategic plan calls for the purposeful development of the Center's four programs.

Counseling

- Clinicians work with individuals to address the issues most pertinent to their growth and development through long-term therapeutic relationships.
- Services offered: individual, couples, family, and group counseling; EMDR; crisis intervention; consultation services; Fertility Education and Support Services
- Future plans: counselors will



expand their strategic affiliations and collaborate with other community-based providers.

Land Program

- Professional staff maintains a sanctuary that offers a stable, safe environment which fosters enjoyment, education and exploration for individuals and groups.
- Land experiences offered: Environmental Education Camps, Community Workdays, Once a Month Kitchen, and volunteer opportunities.
- Future plans: Center staff will work collaboratively with

environmental professionals to expand and deepen the yet 'undeveloped' potential of our property.

Music Therapy

 Clinicians work with individuals and groups to address cognitive and neurological impairments, physical challenges, and limitations in communication and basic life skills.



• Services offered: Individual and group settings including special education classrooms, elder care facilities, hospitals, and at both campuses.

- Future plans:
 - Music therapists will continue to reach out to doctors, psychologists, counselors, and educators in order to expand and enrich their professional network.
 - FLPC will also advocate for state licensure of music therapists. Licensure will increase access to music therapy services by providing financial assistance through insurance.

Art

- Art Director provides an environment for people of all ages to explore their unique artistic expression and to encourage growth in their skills.
- Services offered: workshops for adults and children led by local and nationally known instructors, sketch groups, and group critiques are offered by the Art program.
- Future plans: FLPC values our position within the Art Community in greater Grand Rapids and will continue to work toward being recognized as an active, engaged member of the West Michigan art scene.

In the coming months, the staff of each program will work on the

further development and execution of the plan. Sandy Koteskey, Music Therapy Director states, "As we move forward, we see this plan as a sign of hope for the future focusing on intentional growth and using a specific plan to continue to provide services in West Michigan."
