
Summer Art Experience for Grades 3 - 8

Get to Know the Franciscans

Sister Collette Maritim FSE, BSN, RN, MA moved to Lowell in 2018. Sister shares her thoughts about her experiences as a nurse, in community life, and living in Lowell and Kenya.

Tell us about your work as an oncology nurse at Trinity Health Grand Rapids.

For me, working with cancer patients has opened opportunities not only to care for my patients physically but also spiritually. I spend a lot of time being present to them as they navigate their fears, worries, uncertainties and even despair, praying with them or for them. I feel blessed to have this opportunity to minister to people in the most difficult moments of their lives.

You grew up in Kenya. What was life like for you there?

When I look back to my growing up in Kenya, it strikes me how drastically different it is from living here in the US. My nine siblings and I grew up on a small farm in a village near Rift Valley. We raised chickens, goats, and cattle, had dogs and cats, a garden, and a tea farm for the sustenance of the family.

Apart from helping our parents on the farm when not in school, my life was shaped by living in a village where our lives revolved around village and church activities. Our sense of community was strong. I believe that comes from people living in poverty and their need to lean on each other to survive.

What are some of the gifts of living in community?

One of the principles of the Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist is community life. In many ways, living in community for me is the greatest blessing I have received. Our community life is a sacred place where we have many opportunities to grow as a person. It is a place where we honor and praise God together, enjoy each other's gifts and talents, and celebrate each other's joys as well as accompany one another in our pain and suffering. We make a conscious decision to give our life to God through our daily life by living in community with each other, and from there we go out to minister to the people of God.

In addition to your work as an oncology nurse, what brings you joy?

I feel that God has blessed me in many ways. One of them is my love for music and nature. Singing and drumming were a part of my childhood in Kenya, so I like to listen to all kinds of music. As much as I find joy and peace contemplating nature on my walks on our land, I am even more delighted to share the beauty found in nature with others through making flower arrangements, planting flower beds around our house, caring for our orchard and even taking care of our chickens.

Mother Mary Ann Schmitz FSE, MA is one of the foundresses of the Lowell Campus. Mother is the guiding hand in the development of the land at the Lowell Campus.



Sister Bernice Blaha FSE, BS is a founding



member of the Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist and worked as a pharmacist for many years. Sister prays daily for the needs of the people served by the Center and for prayer requests from the community.

Resident Honeybees on the Farm!

The Franciscan Sisters are entering their third season of keeping honeybees at their farm in Lowell. They are

currently managing four beehives. Last season, the Sisters were able to harvest almost 40 pounds of beautiful raw honey from the hives. With 230 acres of land at the Lowell campus, comprised of various plant communities, the bees have plenty of nectar and pollen sources to forage through the growing season.
