Honey and lip balm are now available for purchase at the Lowell and Grand Rapids campuses. During the 2024 season, staff member Amanda Whitscell-Fischer harvested and bottled over 80 pounds of raw honey from the hives. She also harvested wax and produced an all-natural beeswax lip balm.

Eucharist have been keeping bees periodically since they settled in Lowell in 1973. Amanda works with Sister Collette Maritim FSE on beekeeping. "Not only does beekeeping provide practical benefits to the farm, including pollination, diversity, honey and beeswax," Amanda says, "but the culture of the honeybee hive is also a beautiful example of a community working together for the good of the whole."


News from the Franciscan Sisters

Get to Know the Franciscans

Sister Raffaella Appointed to Leadership Role at Vatican

Sister Raffaella Petrini FSE, BS, MS, Ph.D., has been appointed President of the Pontifical Commission for Vatican City State and Secretary-General of the Governorate of Vatican City by Pope Francis. With this appointment, she becomes the first woman to hold the highest leadership position within the Vatican's administrative structure.



Sister Raffaella, a native of Rome, Italy, has served as the Secretary General of the Governate since 2021. In her new role, Sister will oversee the governance of Vatican City managing its daily operations and policies including security, infrastructure and cultural heritage.

Sister Sarah Doser FSE, MA in Theology, MA in Spirituality, is currently missioned to Boynton Beach, Florida, where she works at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary. Sister Sarah serves as the Director of Field Ministry and is part of the Formation Team for priestly formation. She collaborates with mentors who supervise



the seminarians in ministry service in public service programs, religious education, youth ministry, adult education, hospital and hospice care, prison and juvenile detention placements. She also is available for spiritual direction for members of the Lay Faithful.

Sister Ann Frances Thompson FSE, MA, MT-BC, is

currently missioned to Lewiston,
Maine, where she has four part time
jobs. She is the music therapist for
Andwell Hospice, a private nonprofit agency serving the State
of Maine. She also is the primary
Therapeutic Carriage Driving
Instructor at Riding to the Top in
Windham, ME, a PATH premier
center for therapeutic horseback



riding and driving. Lastly, she is a Behavioral Health Professional working for R.I.S.E., a private for-profit agency serving Maine Care children with disabilities in their homes. Another little side job: she teaches the priests of the Prince of Peace Roman Catholic Parish of Lewiston, ME, piano lessons. For fun, she is a member of the parish Handbell Choir.

Grand Rapids Gallery


Artist **H.J. Slider** takes distressed and discarded items and reclaims and repurposes them into a story-telling narrative similar to the process used by children in
